

Access Statement

As a project we'd like to make the arts and culture as accessible to as many people as possible, and this includes making our exhibitions and space as welcoming to the community as we can.

So while we are a photography-based project, and it's not possible for us to guarantee that everyone will be able to enjoy the exhibitions to the same level, we recognise there are things that we can do to ensure that everyone feels welcome and that we reach out to as diverse an audience as possible.

To ensure that we do this, we have the following arrangements in place to further improve our exhibitions reach:

Exhibition information

All exhibition information is printed as standard in both Welsh and English, along with – where possible to obtain – the artist's original language. We will also have a Polish translation available, as Polish is amongst the most popular foreign languages spoken in the UK, and others on request.

All information is also available in Large Print for people with reading difficulties due to visual impairment.

Audio Description

In addition to information leaflets, we also have audio descriptions for people with visual impairments or learning difficulties. The audio description is recorded on an audio player, which is available with a set of headphones in the gallery and a mini speaker for people who aren't comfortable with earphones.

Gallery Opening Times, Toilet Facilities and Public Access

As a project, our goal has always been to have the gallery open as often as possible, for people who are busy or can only visit the town at certain times due to age or care arrangements. The gallery is open 5 days a week, Tuesday to Saturday, from 11am until 6pm.

We are friendly to the elderly and pregnant women, should anyone need to have a rest or get a glass of water; families with young children do not need to worry about any possible disturbance caused; everyone is always free to come in and enjoy our space!

Our toilet is equipped with a wide door and handrails and is fully accessible for people with limited mobility, or in a wheelchair.

The gallery also has a shallow entrance ramp and no internal stairs or raised door thresholds.
